SUMMARY OF RULES FOR SUMMER SCHOOL CONDUCT

Students are to exhibit courteous behavior at all times. Profanity will not be tolerated. In accordance with NJ STAT. ANN. C.26:3D-55 to C.26:3D-64: **NO SMOKING IS ALLOWED** in school or on the school grounds. **All smokers will be reported.** The student will then be removed from school. All rules of conduct must be obeyed. Students who fail to comply with the regulations of the PCESC Summer School at Wayne will be withdrawn and no course credit will be granted. Tuition and registration fees of any students withdrawn from summer school for disciplinary reasons will not be refunded.

THE FOLLOWING RULES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED:

- No drugs, alcohol, or energy drinks are permitted in the building or on the school grounds.

Descriptions of New Enrichment Courses

Elements of English: This course will introduce new and reinforce previously taught elements of English. These elements include knowledge of grammar skills and fundamentals of writing. This foundation will benefit all students in high school for English courses, HSPA readiness, SAT preparation, and beyond. The core of the instruction will be grammar based. Students will be exposed to lessons that include, but are not limited to, parts of speech, subject verb agreement, verb tense, and punctuation. Beyond the lesson, there will be analysis of writing that effectively uses the day's technique. This writing will serve as a model for proper use of the grammatical technique. Technology is also incorporated to maintain student interest and improve understanding of the strategy.

This grammar instruction will lead to useful writing strategies. The writing reinforcement will include both creative and analytic styles. The skills contained are, but are not limited to, sentence structure, quote integration, and transitional sentences.

Freshman Honors English Readiness: This course will assist students in the transition from middle school to high school, specifically for Honor's English students. It will ensure that students have the foundation of knowledge necessary to be successful in a Freshman Honors English class. The curriculum was created based on conversations and requests made from teachers of these courses. The foundation of this course is grammar and writing. The class will consist of the skills that students are expected to have when entering this High School curriculum. Some of the lessons will reinforce items that were taught in middle school, while others will introduce new concepts.

In addition to the skills, students will read literature that will serve as models for the grammar and writing techniques taught. Also, through this course, students will have the opportunity to work on the required summer reading. This will ensure an understanding of this text that will allow for success on the assessment presented at the beginning of the year. All of this material will allow students to start their experience in Freshman Honors English on a positive path.

Prep Course for AP Biology: The purpose of this course is to prepare incoming students signed up to take AP Biology with an overview of the courses' curriculum, structure, and demands. In so doing, the goal of the program is to survey the 'Big Ideas' that the College Board requires in an effort to prepare students for the depth of material to be addressed from September to May (when the national exam is held).

The exam is another major component of the summer course, as students will be given the opportunity to learn in depth knowledge about the AP exam format and complete sample questions.

Additionally, there is a laboratory based component. Students will be exposed to the recently redesigned laboratory exercises outlined by College Board and be provided the opportunity to go over the lab's purposes and related content material. Students will also potentially be able to do a trial run of some of these labs.

Initiating this program in the summer of 2012 will be exceptionally beneficial as the College Board has made a complete overhaul of the course, utilizing a newly organized curriculum, framework, and national exam. In addition, they have revamped the laboratory component of the course and place a stronger emphasis on inquiry. Students who take this summer course would be introduced to all of these changes and be given a chance to learn how various learning styles can adapt to ensure a successful year in the course as well as an excellent score on the AP exam.

A Taste of Consumer Sciences: This enrichment course will provide the opportunity for students to learn about a variety of topics related to Family and Consumer Sciences. It will include child care techniques and responsibilities, the effects of color and design in a room as well as drawing floor plans and designing a bedroom. In addition, careers related to the Family and Consumer Sciences areas will be included. The course will encourage application of learning through hands on projects and discussions.
